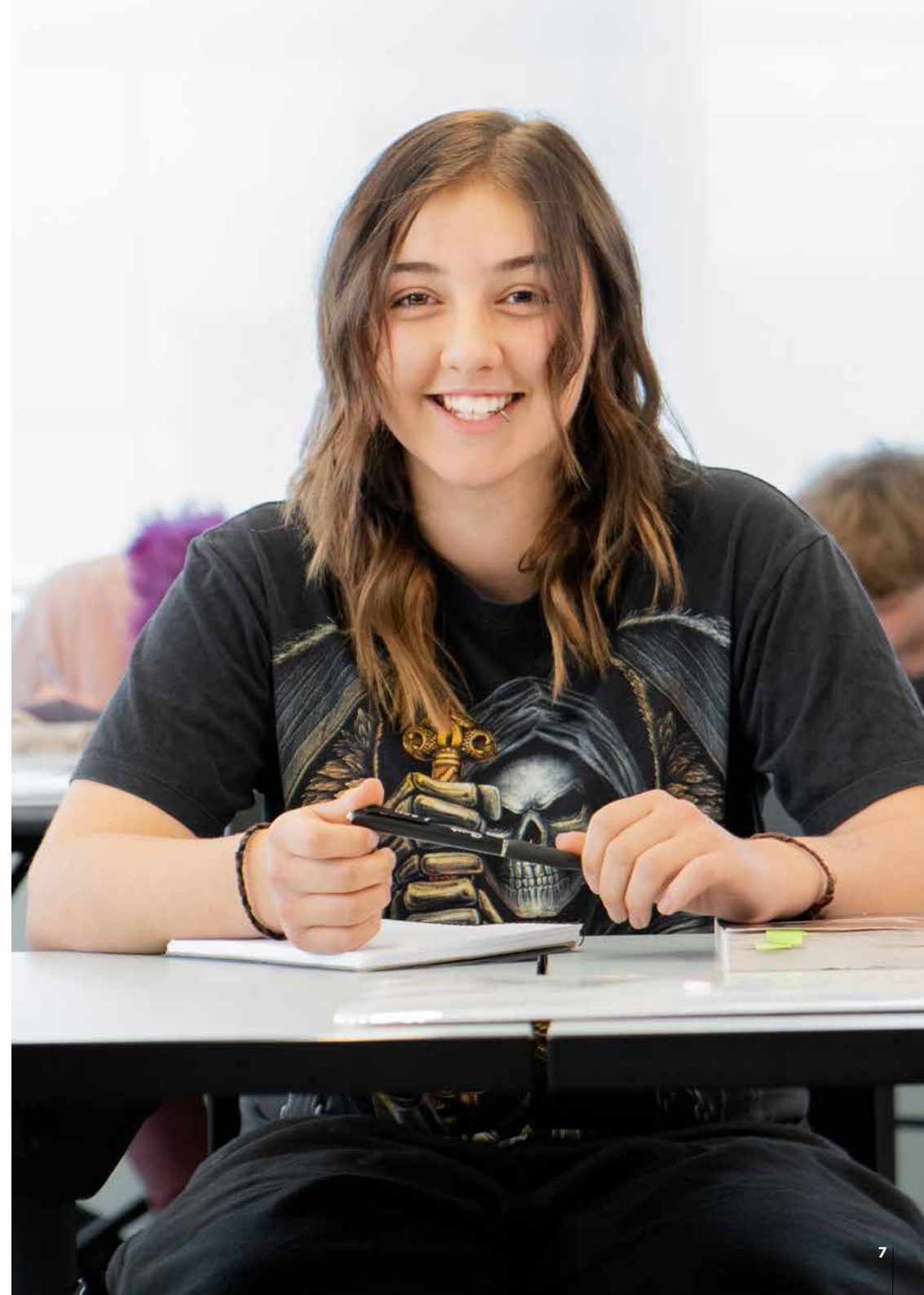

STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) provides students with the opportunity to integrate on-the-job experience with secondary study as part of the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE), the VCE Vocational Major or the Victorian Pathways Certificate. THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

PLACE ALLOCATION

For courses that run over two years, priority will be given to students in Year 11 for the first year. Year 12 students will not be accepted into the first year of a two year program.

Running of courses is dependent upon sufficient student numbers. Courses may be cancelled if minimum course numbers are not met.

PROGRAM COSTS

All VETDSS programs offered through Kangan Institute incur fees. Program costs vary for each program and are confirmed with schools prior to enrolment. Kangan Institute invoices the secondary school directly for all programs and any student fees payable are set by the individual secondary schools. All costs are invoiced directly to schools after the census date determined by Kangan Institute. Kangan Institute will not directly invoice VETDSS participants or their parents.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. Absences: Students are required to notify their VET Coordinator of non-attendance. Students must attend a minimum of 80 percent of a Kangan Institute VET program.
2. Punctuality: Students are expected to arrive on time to all classes. Students who arrive more than 10 minutes after the class has started will be marked as late and their secondary school will be notified. In some practical areas due to OHS students may be refused entry if late.
3. Catch-up classes: Students may be required to attend catch-up classes after school or during school holidays.
4. Code of Conduct: Students are expected to behave in a professional and courteous manner at all times; discipline procedures do apply.
5. Withdrawal: Students who wish to withdraw from a VETDSS program must contact their VET Coordinator who will inform Kangan Institute. Schools will not be charged a fee if the VETDSS Team are notified of the withdrawal before the census date.
6. Communication: Kangan Institute communicates directly with schools regarding the progress of students. Parents should direct queries to their school's VET Coordinator who will contact Kangan Institute on their behalf.

Please note that students who fail to abide by these course requirements may be withdrawn from the Kangan Institute VET program and will be charged for the full cost of the program.

DELIVERY OPTIONS

All VETDSS programs are delivered on site and require students to attend a Kangan Institute campus. Where programs may have some delivery on-line, schools and students will be notified of the timetable in advance.

HOW TO APPLY

1. Select a program from this VETDSS Course Guide.
2. Contact the VET Coordinator at your school to discuss eligibility and confirm costs.
3. The VET Coordinator at your school will apply via the VETDSS Portal.
4. Kangan Institute will notify schools of successful student applications.
5. Your school will then notify you of times, campuses and equipment requirements.

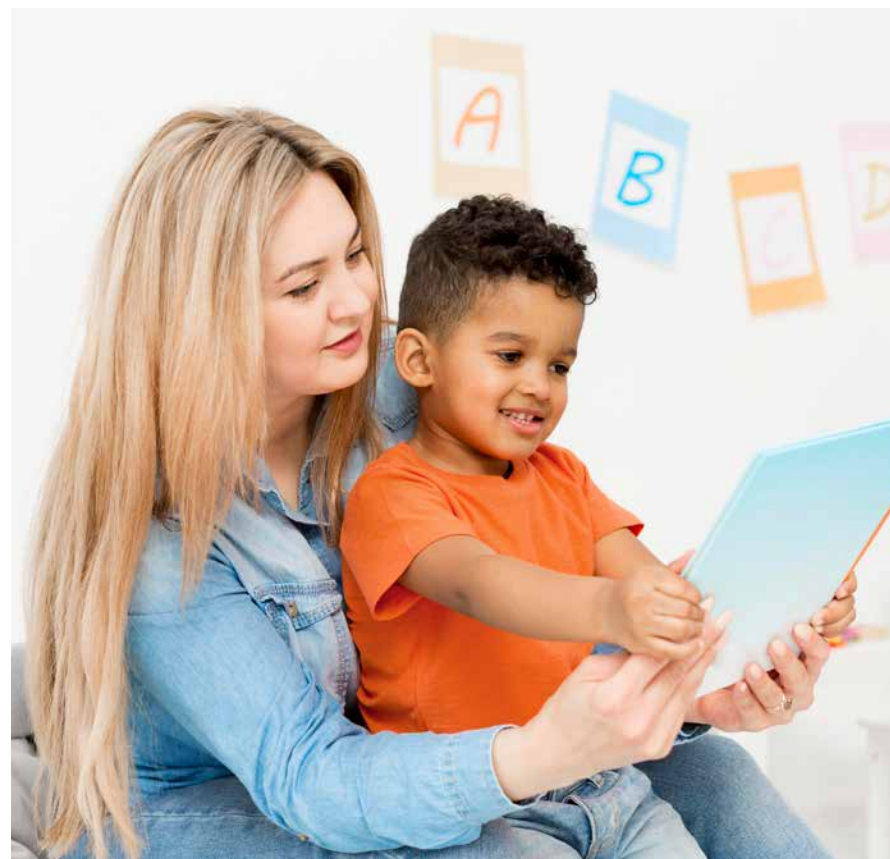
